

THE CURRICULUM

- Students in Year 7 and Year 8 take part in: English, maths, science, Spanish, geography, history, RE, PE, music, drama, art, ICT, PSHE, food and nutrition and textiles.
- 2. In Year 9 students begin to specialise but continue to study a full suite of subjects.
- 3. In Year 10 and Year 11 all students study English, maths, science, RE, Spanish and PSHE. They have a choice between history or geography and two choices from sport, music, drama, art, photography, health and social care, business and ICT.

LEARNING HABITS

Completing work outside of lessons is important to consolidate and master learning. It helps students to develop their organisational skills and it shows that they are hard working

Learning habit 1: Homework and deadlines

Demonstrating our learning habit for homework and deadlines at Dixons Unity Academy means:

- 1. Returning all letters and reply slips within 48 hours.
- Completing all homework on time. Almost all homework is online and is set and due weekly in line with the schedule. Other homework will be set regularly by class teachers.

Learning habit 2: On task

Being on task at Dixons Unity Academy means:

- 1. Following the learning mode of the classroom or learning space.
- 2. Following instructions first time, every time.
- 3. Completing all work and asking for help when needed.
- 4. Transitioning quickly and quietly between lessons.
- 5. Falling silent when staff raise their hands.

Learning habit 3: Equipment

Being fully equipped at Dixons Unity Academy means bringing:

- 1. 2 x black pens
- 2. 2 x green pens
- 3. Pencil
- 4. Ruler
- 5. Black whiteboard pen
- 6. Highlighter
- 7. Reading book
- 8. Student planner
- 9. Pencil case
- 10. Academy bag (graffiti free)
- 11. Scientific calculator (optional)

Mobile phones should not be seen or heard in the academy. They should be switched off prior to entering the school and placed in your bag.



Learning habit 4: Punctuality

Punctuality at Dixons Unity Academy means:

- 1. Arriving to school by 8.18am and being in Morning Meeting by 8.20am.
- 2. Taking no longer than four minutes to transition between lessons. Music will play during transition to help students keep time.
- 3. Being on time to line up after break and lunch.

The learning modes referred to above are as follows:

- 1. Respectful whole class in silence tracking (looking at) the teacher.
- 2. Independent silent study in silence working on your own.
- 3. Quiet partners using two-foot voices to work with the person next to you.
- 4. Polite table groups collaborating as a group (this is most often used in practical subjects).

Learning habit 5: Uniform

Perfect uniform at Dixons Unity Academy means:

- 1. Black trousers (not jeans, leggings or tracksuit bottoms).
- 2. White buttoned shirt.
- 3. DUA branded grey / black / blue blazer and / or jumper.
- 4. Black polishable shoes or boots (not trainers or pumps).
- 5. No jewellery except a plain watch (smart watches are not allowed). A Sikh Kara may also be worn.
- 6. No unnatural hair colours. No false nails. No false eyelashes.
- 7. Students can opt to wear plain black salwar kameez or tunic with a white blouse / shirt with the academy blazer over the top.
- 8. Hijabs, scarves, turbans, crowns, and top knots worn for religious reasons, must be plain black and well secured.
- 9. Academy bag in the correct colour for their year group (graffiti free) provided by Dixons Unity Academy in the first instance.

PE kit at Dixons Unity Academy is as follows:

- 1. Academy navy polo shirt.
- 2. Navy shorts, tracksuit bottoms or sports leggings (branded or unbranded).
- 3. Trainers (indoor and outdoor).
- 4. Optional items: academy navy guarter zip top.

Learning habit 6: Positive response

Positive response at Dixons Unity Academy means:

- 1. Treating other students and staff with respect.
- 2. Not using offensive or poor language around the building.
- 3. Accepting responsibility when a mistake is made. Adults' decisions should be respected.
